

What Extension Springs Handle on an Overhead Garage Door

An **extension spring** supports the weight of an **overhead garage door**. These springs are usually mounted along the horizontal garage door tracks, one on each side of the door. As the door closes, the springs stretch and store energy. When the door opens, that energy assists in raising the door and reduce the force required from the **garage door opener** or the person operating it.

A properly sized spring makes it possible to lift the **garage door weight**. The springs work with pulleys and **lift cables** that run along both sides of the door. If an extension spring breaks, no longer holds tension, or becomes damaged, the cables may loosen and the door can become hard or dangerous to operate.

Extension spring systems are different from a **torsion spring** system, which mounts on a shaft above the door. Both systems use stored mechanical energy, but their hardware, adjustment procedures, and failure risks are not the same. A technician should identify the system before recommending replacement parts or quoting garage door repair pricing.

- **Unusual sounds:** A **loud popping sound**, snapping noise, grinding, or repeated garage door noise can indicate spring or cable problems.
- **Worn cables:** A **frayed lift cable** should be treated as a serious warning, particularly if it is dragging against a bracket or pulley.
- **Opener stress:** A door that is too heavy can result in opener strain, repeated shutdowns, or premature motor and gear wear.

Do not dismiss a door that begins to close unevenly or slam shut. The problem may be related to spring tension, a damaged pulley, a bent garage door track, or a cable that has slipped off its drum. Continuing to operate the door can damage panels and hardware and may present a serious injury hazard.

Garage door safety should remain the top concern. Keep children, pets, and bystanders at a safe distance from a damaged door. Do not stand beneath a raised door that is being supported only by an opener or a provisional object. If the door is unstable, schedule professional repair rather than repeatedly trying it.

Why Extension Spring Repairs Need Professional Service

Extension springs hold considerable energy even when they appear small. Adjusting or removing one without the proper tools and procedure can cause the spring, cable, pulley, or mounting hardware to move unexpectedly. The main risk is unmanaged **spring tension**, which can discharge through a broken component or improperly secured connection.

Many systems also require **safety cables**. These cables pass through the extension springs and help contain a spring if it breaks. They do not make a damaged system secure to handle, but they can lower the risk of a spring flying across the garage. Missing, loose, or corroded safety cables should be changed during professional repair.

A qualified **garage door technician** can inspect the spring rating, door weight, track condition, pulley system, cable routing, and attachment points. The technician can also determine whether the opener has been compensating for a deteriorating spring. An opener is designed to move a balanced door, not to lift the full door weight by itself.

Professional repair also helps avoid a mismatch between the spring and the door. An incorrectly sized spring may cause poor garage door balance, premature failure, excessive force, or unsafe closing. A safety inspection should cover the opener's reversing system, photo-eye sensors, fasteners, hinges, rollers, tracks, and cable connections.

Find out whether the technician is a licensed contractor when licensing applies to the planned work, and verify insurance, warranty terms, payment expectations, and after-hours pricing. A reputable provider should be willing to explain the repair before beginning and should not pressure you into a complete replacement without explaining the condition of the existing door.

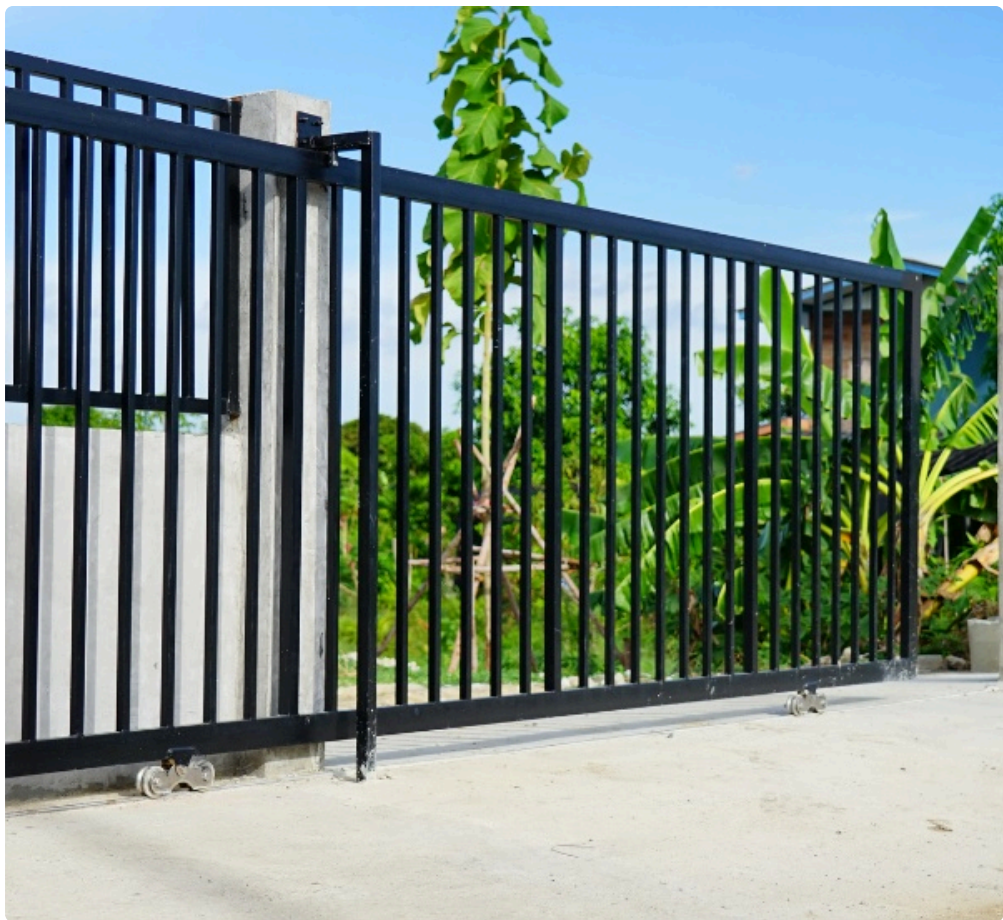
