Battle-Scarred (BS) 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or peeling paint. (Some skins look surprisingly cool in this condition!)

The Anatomy of the CS2 Skin Market

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is among the most interesting micro-economies in gaming history. Powered by the Steam Community Market and different third-party trading and cash-out platforms, uncommon virtual products can command rates ranging from a few cents to hundreds of countless dollars.
