

AELO Swiss Academy sits in the Swiss aviation-training ecological community with a clear identity: an airline pilot education and learning company, developed in Switzerland in 1985. It presents itself as an Accepted Training Company favorably number CH.ATO.0311, and it runs with a main base at Locarno Flight terminal in Gordola, plus a satellite base at Lugano Airport terminal in Agno.
