Wear Condition Drift Value Range Visual Characteristics **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, perfect surface with very little to no scratches. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Very light wear, usually a few minor scuffs on close assessment. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable scratches and endure popular edges and paint. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, paint fading, and noticeable scratches across the body. **Battle-**

Scarred (BS) 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or peeling paint. (Some skins look surprisingly cool in this condition!)

The Anatomy of the CS2 Skin Market

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is one of the most remarkable micro-economies in video gaming history.
