

Understanding the Crash Gambling Multiplier: How It Works and What Players Should Know

Note: The likelihood of hitting the greater multipliers is low; the distribution of crash points is created to favour the house over the long term.

The Mathematics Behind the Crash Multiplier

- 1. Random Number Generation (RNG)**-- Modern crash games rely on cryptographic RNGs to make sure fairness. Each crash point is generated individually and can not be predicted from previous rounds.
