3. Drop Rates and Probabilities

The official drop probabilities (as published by Valve) for each rarity in a standard CS2 case are:

Rarity	Approximate Drop Rate
Mil-Spec (Blue)	79.92%
Restricted (Purple)	15.98%
Classified (Pink)	3.20%
Covert (Red)	0.64%
Rare Special Item (Gold)	-- Knife 0.25%

Thus, on average, **1 out of every 400 openings** yields a knife (or glove) skin. The specific knife design (e.g., Bayonet vs. Karambit) is selected from a pool of readily available knives for that case, each similarly most likely

within the Rare Special Item tier.

Suggestion: Float values listed below 0.02 (Factory New) often command a 30-50% premium over battle-scarred counterparts.
